Third Annual Harvest Festival a Huge Success

On Sunday, October 30, Bethlehem Christian Church hosted its third annual Community Harvest Festival.

Beginning at 5:00pm, children from the church and the community gathered for food, games, and old-fashioned family fun.

In Graham Hall, the children could try their hand at various games of skill, such as the Pop-a-Verse Dart Throw, the Fishing Game, the Touchdown for Jesus Football Toss, the pumpkin-themed Bean Bag Toss, Bobbing for Apples, and the Candy Corn Relay. All who tried were rewarded with candy and prizes.

Also available in Graham Hall was a Cake Walk, where over twenty children and adults won prize cakes and pies, and Face Painting.

Outside, a Hay Ride took children on a thrilling trip around the church property in a trailer loaded with hay bales.

Many delicious treats were also served to the children, including hot dogs, drinks, popcorn, and cotton candy.

Throughout the evening, Christian clown Merry Heart made balloon animals and offered temporary tattoos. She also had a special presentation for the children, where she amazed them with an assortment of tricks and presented them with a Gospel message.

The festival ended with a costume contest for both the children and the adults. Medals were awarded for the top three costumes in each age division.

"This year's Harvest Festival was a great success, with an estimated 150 children and adults coming out to enjoy the evening's activities," commented David Salerno, Bethlehem's Youth Director.
