Youth Director's Corner by David Salerno

At this time of the year, our thoughts turn to the scene that unfolded in Bethlehem over 2,000 years ago. This month, I would like to share with you the devotion I shared with the Alphas after our trip to the nursing home.

Luke 2 is probably one of the most read passages of Scripture during the Christmas season. It tells the complete story of the birth of Jesus, from the time Joseph and Mary traveled to Bethlehem, until the time they found Jesus among the teachers in the temple. But, hidden in the middle of this chapter is a verse that has a great deal of significance for each and every one of us:

"For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord."

--Luke 2:11 (KJV)

"...unto you is born a Saviour..."

But just who was the angel talking to? Joseph? Mary?

No, the angel was delivering this message to a group of shepherds keeping watch over their flocks outside the town of Bethlehem.

So why did the angel say "unto you"? Why didn't he say "unto Joseph and Mary"?

The truth is, Jesus was not born to Joseph, or to Mary. Rather, He was born to each and every one of us, to show us how to live, to ultimately die for our sins, and to provide us all hope for eternal life.

"...unto **you** is born a Saviour..."

Just remember this Christmas season that the best gift we could hope for has already been given to us, born over 2,000 years ago, in a barn, behind an inn with no room, in the tiny town of Bethlehem.

All we have to do is reach out and accept it.

The Pathfinders also helped with the Living Nativity.

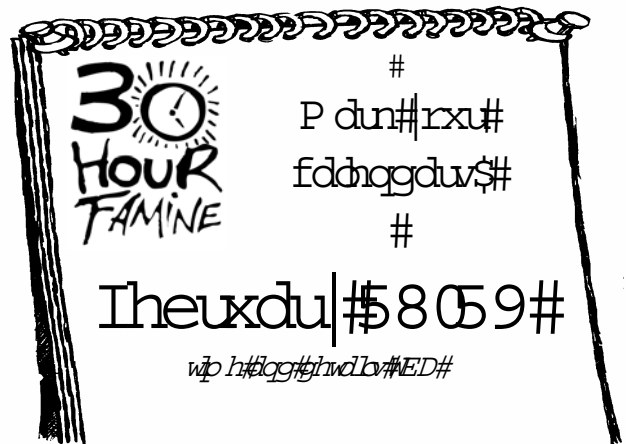
